

Cathy Corkery-Pollywog Specialist:

I went on the road this month to experience a few LBCC Parenting Education Classes.

- *Together Class*
- *Live and Learn with your Baby*
- *Live and Learn with your Toddler*

What I observed was how valuable these classes are for the little ones and their parents. The parents shared how great it was to have undistracted one-on-one time with their child, be able to meet other parents that share the same experience, and how informational the classes have been for them and their child.

What was unique to me was how the child knew that the class was a special time for them and their parent. I loved seeing how the child would light up with a big smile as they came into the class full of friends and sensory objects/activities that they got to explore; all within the attentiveness of their parents. Wow!

Through research we know how important strong relationships are for building emotional/social health and resiliency and this was a great example of building and nurturing the parent/child relationship at a very early age. With the development of the Pollywog Project we hope to increase the awareness and accessibility of local parenting education classes for all parents.
