The Early Learning Hub is coordinating efforts for a shared Equity Training for all Early Learning Division contractors in our three county region.

Our goal will be to set aside priority registration for ELD contractors and then open registration to our community partners until space is filled.

We are working with partners in Lincoln county to live-stream the training so everyone can participate without the additional drive time. This will also greatly increase our capacity.

This collaboration allows us to share the cost of this required training between agencies, reducing the burden on smaller contractors and increasing the quality for one large event.


Data & Evaluation Work Group Data Book

At the Governing Board meeting and retreat in March, the Data & Evaluation Work Group presented their current outline for our regional Data Book.

This Data Book will present various health, education, social, and economic factors of our region's children ages 0 – 6 years. This will include census demographic data, kindergarten assessment and 3rd grade reading scores, SPARK/early learning data, and other data related to kindergarten readiness and social determinants of health. In addition, narrative summaries aim to further explain the meaning and significance of the data.

This Data Book is inspired by the Central Oregon Regional Health Assessment and intended to support data informed decision-making by the Governing Board.
