<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	<b>HB+HC Summary</b> (Lynn Hall)	
Review of the grant requirements and what we are trying to accomplish: informed planning for children with the highest needs.		
Contacting trusted organizations who are working directly with these families, and asking them to join us. The organizations are very excited and want to participate.		
Partner organizations will be holding focus groups or surveys (process is yet to be determined) for us to ask questions of their families. Serving as a bridge to these local families because they know who they are. Partners will get incentive stipends to help defray their costs, if they need them.		
Working with the Data & Evaluation Work Group to come up with a small number of questions so that we get "apples-to-apples" responses.		
Lynn discussed the NW Health Foundation's priorities: change systems and promote advocacy.		
Listen to those with disparities.		
Be creative and innovative.		
Review of the Healthy Beginnings + Healthy Communities Planning Meeting on Monday, 3/16:		
Lots of time spent on analyzing questions to present to our partner families		
Reaching out to special target groups		
Information gathering to help the Hub know where to spend funding dollars		
Meeting with partners to speak to families that we haven't heard from before		
Timeline for introductory grant: due in August. 10 of 25 grant recipients will get implementation grants in the fall

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	<b>Action Points</b> (Lynn Hall)	
Tami Tracer – Map of Providers:		
Handed out map that shows provider locations in each of the three counties		
90% of OHP participants are seen by these providers		
Oregon Pediatric Society (OPS) may have collected ASQ implementation data after the physician training		
South Lincoln and Benton counties are also served by Trillium CCO		
Jerri Wolfe – ASQ background information:		
Jerri talked about the Linn County Developmental Screening Project and the training meeting where Physicians and providers were taught to use ASQs and how to refer people to other agencies for help. There is no data to know how many of these providers have implemented ASQs as part of their regular practice. OPS kept records of which providers followed through, but we don't have that data. State of Oregon didn't want to tell physicians that they MUST use ASQ screenings, but they were hoping that the physicians would see the value and implement them.		
The Number of ASQ screenings completed by physicians are counted on the Hub metrics. We need the number completed by physicians		
Jerri also talked about Safe Schools Project (hand-out) – training and give away of free ASQ kits to providers		
After the training, referrals to early intervention rose 100%		
Parents often wonder if something is wrong, and ASQs give them the tools to self-diagnosis		
Jerri suggested that each county have an ASQ box and the ability to take it to fairs, exhibits, etc.		
Early Learning Meeting on 5/20/2013 – snapshot of what they thought the metrics and resources were.		
State has developed an ASQ “Set-To” Training		
Mellie Bukovsky, JoAnne Hunter, and Rachelle Saceda are all trained ASQ Trainers (in the State's method: a 6-hour session)		
ASQs are available in English and Spanish		
Families didn't get copies of ASQs, but the physician kept a copy for their records		
The Safe Schools Project made a map of who does screenings in Linn county		
Lincoln and Benton counties were not included in the ASQ model work conducted in Linn County		
In any given population, a certain percentage can be expected to have special needs—we just have to find them.		
Provider checklist and other documents were lost from State Early Learning website		
Work Plan Outcome #2: increase the number of children who receive a developmental screening—by the ASQ—before the age of 3		
We discussed ways to accomplish this outcome: offer incentives to parents to take ASQ to providers		
Offer incentives to get parents to sign a waiver to send ASQ to providers electronically		
Send completed ASQ to providers electronically		
Survey parents to see what works for them		
Survey pediatricians to see what works for them (CCO could do this for us)		
<b>CONCLUSIONS</b>		
The Work Group decided to meet with Early Childhood Coordinating Council Work Group and work on this ASQ piece		
Volunteers for the ASQ Subcommittee: Chrystee Houser, Jerri Wolfe, Rebecca Austen, and MaiKia Moua.		
Work Group believes that ASQs are being done but not being put into the hands of physicians

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	<b>Map Family Contacts w/Health Care from Pregnancy thru Age 5 (Lynn Hall)</b>	
Some children do not see a doctor again, after delivery until they are 4 or 5 years old		
Can anything be done about this? Dr. Cousins wanted to talk about this, but is unable to be with us today		
Aligning ASQs with physicians might fix family contact lapses		
One of the ways we connect with underserved kids is thru ASQs and health care		
Lincoln County does a lot of home visits and helps to link people in		
Shelley Paeth spoke about the "Durham Connects" program from Durham County, NC, which has a great home visiting program.		
We need to know the numbers of children we are currently serving and number of how many more we want to serve		
The State's RFA made us create a "Global Budget" of who is currently being served by each agency. The resulting data is messy—lots of overlap among kids		
Data and Evaluation Work Group needs to help us drill down on target population:		
School catchment areas?		
Where do they live?		
Where do they go to school?		
Where do they go to the doctor?		
To make decisions when financial opportunities arise we need the Data and Evaluation Work Group to indicate the priority areas
