DISCUSSION ITEM	IHN-CCO 2015 Report
	We have two shared metrics with the IHN-CCO: Developmental Screenings and Well-Child Visits.
	Reviewed hand-outs from IHN-CCO with developmental screening numbers. Broken down by county. 2014 numbers. 2015 numbers. Significant increase shown.
	Reviewed hand-out from IHN-CCO with well-child visits information. Numbers only reflect Oregon Health Plan kids.
	We have been holding meetings with Kim Whitley regarding the Pollywog Project, and she would like to know how ASQs are being tracked and how we deal with duplicates.
	All star-rated programs have a mandate to do ASQs.
	No way to know where all ASQs are being done.
	The point is that referrals are being made from ASQs.
	Not all agencies send in ASQs to medical providers.

DISCUSSION ITEM	ASQ Pathways
	In Lincoln County, Health Nurses are negotiating with providers who don't have electronic records. DO we want to scan in or input original information into EPIC.
	In this region EPIC is a central database, so we would probably need to input it into EPIC ourselves.
	EPIC would need to create an import function to trap the data.
	Would it be helpful to have a "super-user" from Samaritan come and demonstrate EPIC? Yes, but it will make your head spin!
	RHIC (Regional Health Information Collaborative) members might be our first stop, and we could talk to them about uploading ASQs.

The Ages and Stages people have an importing function that they can sell you, but it costs a lot more.
Headstart does an ASQ when a child first comes to them, and they keep a paper copy.
In our region, there are 19,270 0-6 year olds.
In our region, there are 11,429 children at-risk.
In our region, there are 1,029 children in star-rated child care programs.
In our region, there are 2,681 children in C2Q programs (working on a QRIS rating).
Another collaboration with the CCO would be to figure out the duplication issues: where people are going and getting ASQs.
Visiting people to make sure that ALL kids are getting at least one screening.
Some people don't want a label placed on their kid so they are deliberately not getting them screened.
Would also like to include the parent-voice on this.
The second metric is that between the ages of 0-15 months, each child will get a well-child visit.
We need more information about how non-providers are doing ASQs.
There is \$11,000 in the Hub budget that has been set aside for ASQ training this biennium.
Benton County could really use the trainings!
Let's plan a training at our next meeting.
The agenda says that we should review incentives for ASQ review in pediatrician's office, but it's premature to worry about that at this time.
Reviewed referral form from the Lincoln County EI/ECSE.
In Benton County, agencies are asked to not refer but to support the parents to self-refer.
