DISCUSSION ITEM	Funding Committee Targeted Investment Allocation – Approval Needed

Kristi asks the Board to weigh in on the proposed target allocation strategies.

Lincoln school district offers 100% free-and-reduced lunch with a 14% homeless rate for children.

Lincoln & Benton counties each make up 21% of the at-risk population in our three-county region with Linn making up 58%. (Based on data from our original Hub application)

Since Oregon doesn't release data for at-risk populations by county, there isn't current at-risk data.

We need approval from the Board to approve the targeted investment allocation with the revision that # of projects per county change to:

- 4 projects for Linn County, 2 projects for Benton County, 3 projects for Lincoln County.
- This maintains a cap of \$5,000 per project per county.
- Should we receive limited applications, the default strategy reverts to even distribution between the threecounty region.

#### **Funding Committee Recommendations**

To maintain the validity of the RFA process, this content is confidential and only to be viewed by Board Members or their proxies. Only the Board agenda will be posted to the Hub website until after the Board has taken action on this item. Letters of Interest will be posted as a separate document for your review.

- Letters of Interest were due on May 18th by 5 PM
- We received 7 LOI's with 1 being regional, 1 Linn County specific, 1 Benton County specific, and 4 Lincoln County specific
- We have \$45,000 available funds
- LOI's requested \$42,500
- The Funding Committee met via conference call on May 22<sup>nd</sup> to review all LOI's
- All LOI's are from new partners with the exception of one who has submitted for planning of a new project.

The Funding Committee recommends funding all LOI's pending successful contract negotiations. There are additional points of clarification that are needed from the SMART initiative. It is also recommended that we offer the full \$5000 available to Yacht's to support their proposed work if they feel they could successfully spend down the funds in the contract time period.

#### POLLYWOG PROGRESS REPORT

As of June 11, 2018

#### **Statistics:**

- Individuals enrolled in Pollywog Program 412
- Number of courses (prenatal and postnatal) offered 32
  - Includes classes in all three counties
  - Includes prenatal classes at all five hospitals
  - Includes classes/workshops/playgroups/support groups taught in all three counties.
- LBCC Parenting Education classes are seeing a 40% increase in registration over this time last year in the pilot area:
  - Have had to add an additional toddler class
  - All classes offered Spring Term in Albany were full
  - Serving 21 more families than same time last year
  - The Parenting Success Network has reported that all of their Spring Term classes were full, and their evening one-night workshops were averaging 45 attendees
- Community Partners (trained) Kidco Head Start (4), Samaritan Albany General Hospital
   (6), Family Connections (4), Linn County Health Department (2), Family Tree Relief Nursery (2),
   Old Mill Center (3), and a Maternity Care Coordinator at Good Samaritan
- Community Partners in Progress DHS, WIC, LBL-ESD, Greater Albany Public Schools/ Welcome Center, Community Services Consortium
- Parent Blog In April began running a parent blog on our website, in English and Spanish. Seeing large visitor spikes on our website on the days it is published
- English/Spanish Website Our website is available in English and Spanish. In 2017, our website was accessed 498 times by individuals who used it in Spanish
- Devices Our website is mobile-friendly. Our site is accessed 72.9% of the time on a computer desktop, 23.8% on a mobile device, and 3.3% on a tablet
