<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Strategies to Improve Immunization Rates
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Update on the data request to the CCO</li> </ul>	
Kim Whitley with IHN-CCO was unable to provide Lynn immunization data from clinics.	
Rex Larson, the Vaccines for Children Program Coordinator, introduced Lynn to Heather Amrhein from Oregon Health Authority (OHA).	
Kim is looking for a representative to attend the next Health Care Integration Work Group meeting.	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>What is AFIX? – Heather Amrhein, Oregon Health Authority</li> </ul>	
Oregon AFIX is a partnership designed to support health care personnel in identifying opportunities to improve immunization practices and 2-year-old immunization rates.	
OHA is currently targeting clinics with high numbers of children who are CCO members.	
Next Steps:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Cindy Cole recommends the utilization of a champion community member to promote immunizations.</li> <li>The group discusses working with our partners to survey parents from low percentage immunization communities regarding the barriers to immunizations.</li> <li>Heather recommends reaching out to agencies with high immunization rates for insight into their success.</li> </ul>	

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transportation issues is a barrier to acquiring immunization.</li> <li>• Each work group member agrees to look into their own agencies to determine how they currently address immunizations. This will be specific to children under two years old.</li> </ul>

If your agency doesn't have requirements, how does your agency convey the health community recommendations to parents?</li> <li>4. Which barriers does your agency face?</li> <li>5. Which barriers do your parents face?</li> </ol>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discuss the video that parents are required to watch if they refuse vaccines?</li> <li>• Which doctor offices are not sending immunizations to the Alert System?</li> </ul>
<p>When agencies don't report immunization records to the Alert System, we receive inaccurate data.</p>
<p>Heather explains the state now offers trainings on the Alert System to providers.</p>
