DISCUSSION ITEM	Strategies to Improve Immunization Rates
	Cindy D'Angiolillo recommended collaborating with Boost Oregon to increase parent workshops across the tri-county region.
	Boost Oregon is a parent-led community that educates other parents about vaccines and dispels rumors that circulate online or among their peers, and includes parents, doctors, nurses, naturopaths, midwives, doulas, and community members.
	Lynn, Jennie, and Cindy D. attended a Boost Oregon Provider Training led by Pediatrician and Boost Oregon volunteer Dr. Jay Rosenbloom.
	Cindy plans to invite Dr. Rosenbloom to present to medical personnel, including Samaritan, as well as other interested agencies.
	Hub staff plans to attend the Boost Oregon Parent Workshop in August.
	Cindy D. reminds the group about the peer immunization reviewed journal article, which will be posted on basecamp once it's published.
	Family Tree is hosting a presentation with The Community Doula Program, who specially trained to provide support during the critical months of pregnancy, birth and the early months of parenting.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Potential Partner Survey This list will aid us while working with Nadeen.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maternity Care Coordinators Transportation is a barrier for families. This is especially true for large families due to getting ready, driving, and being at the office. Head Start offers transportation.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Live and Learn with Your Baby Instructors These instructors request journal articles to read, as well as educational materials (posters and flyers). It is not sustainable to create a formal plan for presenting on immunizations during these classes.
	Next Steps:
	Jennie agrees to contact Sam Schafer with the Lincoln County Health Department about collaborating with Boost Oregon and the Hub in developing these materials. She will then connect with Nadine Gartner from Boost Oregon in order to move forward.
	The Hub will contact Nadine about leading a Train the Trainer program for home visitors.

DISCUSSION ITEM	Medical Decision Tree and Parent Letter
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review Colleen Reuland's Phone Call: What does that mean for our Decision Tree?

The OPIP model is based on decision tree models used during medical school.
Colleen suggests referring a child to a developmental/behavioral pediatrician out-of-region.
OPIP is in conversation with OHA about creating a better referral process.
OPIP contracts with agencies to implement their projects.
OPIP works extensively with medical providers; their medical decision tree is one aspect.
There is complex health care context to be considered in creating a medical decision tree.
Colleen agrees to reach out with information regarding the OPIP decision tree webinars in October and November.
Colleen invites the hub to discuss funding opportunities for contracting with OPIP.
Next Steps:
Jennie and Shirley will ask Kristi about creating a video of Shirley taking her children to get immunizations for the Pollywog Parent Voice blog.
Use the Parent Letter to determine how to redirect the Medical Decision Tree as a referral flow chart.
Lynn will connect with Kristi regarding the Medical Decision Tree statewide movement.
