	LeAnne will support the facilitation of the Health Care Integration work group. Pollywog is closely associated with the health care sector.
	Pollywog is a community resource in the Unite Us database. Pollywog serves as the early learning resource. Due to housing being a barrier to adequate health care, Unite Us is focusing on housing resources in Linn County.

	Unite Us will serve Linn, Benton, and Lincoln counties.

DISCUSSION ITEM	Parent-Focused Boost Trainings
	Shirley is attending the Boost training for parents to determine if it's a good fit for the Hub to host a future training.
	The group explains Boost Oregon to Amy.
	Samaritan Pediatrics in Corvallis meets regularly twice per month for a provider meeting and a staff meeting. Miranda attends these meetings. Amy creates the agendas.
	Parents need to regain trust in the vaccines schedule and the vaccines, themselves. Trust begins conversations.
	Community Care Coordinators are a vital asset to supporting and guiding vaccine-hesitant parents.

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Early Learning Council Strategic Plan & 2019 CCO Incentive Measures Benchmarks	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lynn explains the two documents to the group. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There is confusion around the IHN-CCO metrics, and the way that the form displays them with no explanations about what they mean. For example, the category, "2019 Improvement Targets" says "Minnesota method with 2% floor" next to each measure, but gives no explanation of what that means. Miranda Miller appeared on the phone line with Amy and told us that she was sending a link to a secondary document that would explain more about what was on the Benchmarks document. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> This conversation is tabled until next month so that we have a chance to look at that secondary document that figures out what each column means. 	
Developmental Screening – LeAnne	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> When DHS removes a child from their family, conducting an ASQ is a component to the Child Protective Services assessment. Pollywog has free access to ASQ software, which means we can help DHS. There is need for a mechanism for coding each ASQ. LeAnne explains that an agency can attach an MOU to their existing contract with Samaritan for scanned ASQs to get paid. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center, their mental health specialist physical health assessment and refer outward to dental. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Adequate dental care is a future IHN-CCO metric. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Connect with Dr. Carissa Cousins. She specializes in pediatrics and serves patients at Mid-Valley Children's Clinic and Samaritan Lebanon Health Center. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Align our work with strategic plan and IHN-CCO metrics. 	
Next Steps:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Connect with agencies that conduct ASQs and Lincoln County representative for the HCI work group. LeAnne will make these connections. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Old Mill Center Health Department, Shelley Paeth Autumn Belloni, Early Intervention / Early Childhood Special Education (inquire about other Lincoln County representatives) 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> LeAnne currently offers trainings on conducting ASQs. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Health Care Education Building, LBCC, and Kidco Head Start in Lebanon has a computer lab. Further conversations need to take place in Lincoln County. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> LeAnne agrees to reach out to Christina Houser with Kidco.
