DISCUSSION ITEM	Welcome and Introductions
	Stacie Dodson is the regional CME coordinator for the Samaritan system.
	Rebecca Austin has stepped down from co-chairing the Health Care Integration work group.

DISCUSSION ITEM	Debrief the Boost Training
	There is a high degree of interest in continuing trainings. One training is currently planned for East Linn County and plans for 1-2 trainings in Lincoln County.
	The group is appreciative of the hard work and successes of this presentation.
	The presenter's laptop was not hardwired while broadcasting to multiple locations. Next Steps: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider asking the presenter to bring a thumb drive with his presentation. • Ask presenter to send the presentation ahead of time.
	At Samaritan Albany General Hospital, IT was unable to log-in for the first part of the presentation.
	Rich and Lynn spoke with IT and believed tech was secure.
	Stacie was unaware of the new Samaritan log-in system.
	Benton County personnel in the Starker Room will have another opportunity to view the presentation on the last Wednesday in March. Cindy will offer Q&A. They experienced video/sound lagging and low-volume.
	Doctor Rosenbloom is only available to present on Mondays.
	IT should run through video/sound prior to an event.
	Cross-system collaboration is difficult. Different sectors have different methods and systems. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who is the appropriate lead? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Nadine Gartner, founder of Boost Oregon, should be the designated lead moving forward. An agency could host the training, but not act as lead coordinator. ○ Communicating via email was frustrating. A new method, possibly a phone conference, is necessary.
	There is a request to present a Boost Oregon training in Lebanon, but its status is unclear.

Both Linn and Lincoln counties are included in the Public Health Modernization grant. It is possible to use this grant to fund future trainings.
Albany and Good Sam have funding for CME lectures. There is need for funding in Lebanon and at the coast.
North Lincoln Hospital (Kimber Silvernagle) and Stacie are in communication about future trainings.
Nadine has reached out to Samaritan for a “train-the-trainers” session. This would include Nina Mattarella, who would become a local trainer for our region.
Early childhood personnel should be included in future trainings.
Boost parent trainings are not regularly attended by the public.
Shirley speaks about a Health Care Integration sub-committee focused on immunization trainings. This would most likely begin in the fall. If anyone would like to attend an upcoming Boost parenting training, Thursday, April 4, 2019.
WIC is supportive of counseling parents on immunizations. One-on-one counseling is successful.

Cindy will reach out with additional parent booklets. • Stacie, Nadine, and Heather (should they agree) will coordinate forthcoming Boost trainings in Linn County. Stacie will contact Lynn with updates. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Cindy will reach out with contact information for Lebanon, Albany, North Lincoln, and Lincoln County Health Department. • Confirm if Nina Mattarella will train providers and/or parents. • Encourage attendance by maternity care coordinators and Early Head Start. • Shirley agrees to reach out to Doctor Dana Kosmala with Samaritan Health Services regarding future Boost parent trainings.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Averages increased for recommending this training post presentation • Almost everyone agrees the presentation was balanced • 20 personnel said this presentation will change their practice; 9 said maybe; 7 nos – however, many personnel already practice motivational interviewing • Presenter rushed his reading lists • Needs diversity in provider’s perspective • Need more role-modeling on how providers can work with hesitant parents.
