DISCUSSION ITEM	Dental Standards in our Region
	The group was stunned and confused about how patients access care from dentists.
	Not many Spanish speaking personnel.
	If a mother is an undocumented immigrant, she cannot get OHP; however, her child can.
	Dental vans offer services on the spot. This is a totally free service for families in-need.
	We need a schematic of what is offered and who qualifies for what.
	Samaritan will be offering a trial period for two dental clinics through Unite Us. Someone needs to reach out to Unite Us to put new dental resources into their database.

	Handed out a document from the Social Determinants of Health Committee, outlining their recommendations to the IHN-CCO for the coming year.
	The group discussed the pros and cons of each recommendation.

DISCUSSION ITEM	Strategic Plan for Behavioral Health, 2020-2024
The group reviewed a document from the IHN-CCO outlining their plan for dealing with behavioral health issues in our region for the next 4 years.	
It was a very clinically written document, and our group doesn't appear to have a reason to assist in this work.	

DISCUSSION ITEM	OHA Access to Care
The group reviewed a document from the Oregon Health Authority, detailing the work being done at each of the CCOs in the state, and whether they met their 2017 benchmarks.	
There was a lot of information in this document, and the group spent a significant amount of time reading and trying to internalize what they were seeing.	
Our regional CCO appears to be doing a good job in a number of areas, and the group discussed what we could do to help them to reach more of their metrics.
