<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Boost Oregon Workshop, LeAnne Trask
	Following discussion last month about Oregon Pediatrics' Society concern about vaccinations and well-baby visits declining in Oregon due to COVID-19, the EL Hub and Pollywog helped to publicize upcoming parent workshops from Boost Oregon.
	Boost Oregon is holding monthly vaccine information workshops for parents. They are led by Rebecca Reveal, a mom and certified physician's assistant.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Oregon Health Authority Update, LeAnne Trask
	The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) released information about COVID-19 affecting Latino communities at a much higher rate than other populations. OHA is concerned that their messaging isn't working or isn't understood.
	In response, OHA has created 12 new specific messages for 12 minority populations.
	It was reported that following the first weekend in May, when the state started opening, there was a large outbreak of COVID-19 in Bend due to family gatherings.
	OHA has also created a new Resource List for Oregonians.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Benton County Health Department Update, LeAnne Trask
	Benton County Health Department asked for help to communicate to immigrant populations about COVID-19 tracer calls, including the importance of such calls, why honesty is needed, and why their help is needed.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	IHN-CCO Update, LeAnne Trask
	IHN-CCO is helping COVID-19 affected families with rent payments and renting blocks of hotel rooms for medically fragile homeless individuals.
	They have seen large numbers of new sign-ups for OHP, including 2500 in Benton County.
	DST is now preparing for their grant funding proposals, and have created a new category called "Promising Practices" for renewed funding for past projects that were successful.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	State of the Babies Yearbook, LeAnne Trask
LeAnne invited others to participate in this upcoming webinar, that focused on how the COVID-19 pandemic has exposed and exacerbated existing disparities and structural barriers that affect young child and their families.
