<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	New Powtoons on ACEs
Katie Berns, the LBL EL Hub Epidemiology Intern, has finished two new Powtoons about ACEs and what they look like for children in our region. They can be found on the EL Hub YouTube channel, and are primarily meant for professionals rather than families.	

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Digital Safety Sessions at Corvallis Library (Follow-up)

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Federal Public Charge Law
Information regarding this law was shared with the work group and can be found in the handouts. Important details to note are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fact sheets are available for families;</li> <li>• WIC is not included in this law;</li> <li>• Children accessing services are not included; and</li> <li>• CAWEM and OHP for pregnant women are not included.</li> </ul>	

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Reach Out Oregon
LeAnne shared information regarding this new service from Oregon Family Support Network. The website offers support and tools, including a chat section and a 'warmline' for parents who need support in	

parenting children with emotional, developmental, or physical health concerns. It is staffed by certified Family Support Specialists who have been trained to assist parents, in either day-to-day frustrations or in a crisis situation. <b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Oregon's Sustainable Health Care Cost Growth Target Committee
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Information was shared about this committee that is tasked with setting a growth cap on health care costs. It is modeled after a similar group in Massachusetts. More information to follow.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Coronavirus update from OHA
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Although this update (from the previous day) was obsolete when the work group met, a discussion regarding what other organizations are planning or doing to keep employees and the public safe. This situation is constantly evolving and the organizations which the work group members represent have now put their plans into place. At this time, the work group will cancel any future in-person meetings until it is safe to hold them. Online meetings are being considered.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Student Success Ace and Coordinated Care
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At the recent state-wide Early Learning Hub Collaborative, the state presented plans for coordinated enrollment in state-funded Preschool Promise slots. Coordinated Enrollment will take place in the EL Hubs with preference for children who are part of Priority Populations. Some present expressed concern of how the EL Hubs would handle this new responsibility. Screenings of families and placement of children will be an important responsibility and the LBL EL Hub plans to use current staff who know the region and providers to cover these responsibilities.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Oregon Preschool Development Grant
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LeAnne attended a meeting of the Student Needs Assessment Committee (SNAC). Data sheets are provided in the handouts and the information will be presented to the governor.

<b>DISCUSSION ITEM</b>	Strategic Plan Outcome Measures
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Lynn shared information related to dental care from the Strategic Plan Expected Deliverables. The work group discussed OHA's Oral Health Metrics with input from work group guests from Capital Dental/Smile Keepers. Capital Dental, the dental insurance plan for local OHP members, is working toward meeting these metrics, particularly dental exams for pregnant women and preventative dental services for children ages one to 14. The work group provided locations and contacts for follow-up.
