# Coordinated Enrollment Update

Coordinated enrollment is taking shape and moving forward. Following the statewide EL Hub Collaborative in February, the Early Learning Division (ELD) tasked all EL Hubs in Oregon with the role of filling all state-funded preschool slots at the Hub level.

The LBL Hub has received a budget and job descriptions with specific duties. We plan to divide the coordinated enrollment duties between two current staff members at this time. They will begin to prepare with training from the state for screening families for eligibility, organizing with providers, and working to ensure everyone – families and providers – are heard and supported.

The LBL Hub will be prepared and ready with coordinated enrollment when everything starts moving again.

## RFA Deadlines Postponed

In response to the coronavirus outbreak in Oregon, the Early Learning Division (ELD) has postponed the deadline for Student Success Act Request for Applications (RFAs) until May 4, 2020.

This new deadline applies to Preschool Promise, Early Learning Equity Fund, Preschool Promise Fiscal Agent, and Oregon Pre-Kindergarten programs.

Applicants can still submit questions to and find answers via the ELD's RFA FAQ section on it's website. The ELD continues to offer assistance via helplines and emails.
