DISCUSSION ITEM	Community Alignment & Family Connects Update
<p>Connie has held two 211 workshops for partners to help them get their 211 listings updated. Another workshop will be scheduled soon. She also shared that one on one support is available.</p> <p>OSU Extension office Lincoln County is the newest Pollywog Partner. They will be an information-only partner as they cannot send or receive digital referrals. The extension office is happy to talk to providers or parents with questions about their services. They offer a lending library of canning and food preservation equipment, all kinds of community classes, and kid programming like 4-H.</p> <p>Connie is continuing provider outreach, especially in Lincoln County. She sends a monthly email to our providers and has been delivering brochures and other information to Lincoln County clinics. Connie is starting a project to develop Family Connects posters with QR codes to hang in clinics, hospitals, and provider offices.</p> <p>Connie shared Family Connects program data. Scheduling rate and population reach data are below program fidelity levels. The program visit completion rate is 57%, close to the fidelity rate of 60%. The Family Connects program depends on the community and also brings a lot of value to the community. Home Visits are intensive and meant to assess the family's needs and connect them to community resources through referrals.</p> <p>Connie shared some data from Duke University about the Family Connects program.</p>

SPECIAL PRESENTATION

Community Doulas

Roslyn Burmond, Program Coordinator of the Community Doula Program and Melissa Cheyney, Community Doula Program Champion, introduced themselves. The Community Doula program is a program from the OSU Anthropology Uplift Lab. In partnership with the IHN-CCO providers, this program culturally, socially, and linguistically matched doula care to Medicaid families in Oregon. They shared the program goals, reproductive justice framework, outcomes, and a recent Push for Doulas event to celebrate their successes and raise funds.

Healthy births are important for a healthy community. Referrals can be sent through their website, which is HIPPA/FERPA compliant.
