<b>Discussion Item</b>	Welcome and Introductions
Workgroup members introduced themselves.	

<b>Special Presentation</b>	Young Roots, Andrea Bartell
<p>Andrea is the executive director of the Young Roots program. She explained that Young Roots is a community-based non-profit formed in Albany to create systemic change through equitable pathways of opportunity for young families to grow into their fullest academic and social potential. She gave an overview of the systemic inequities and disparities that teen parents face and how her program works to support those families. Their multi-generational vision is to give pregnant and parenting adolescents through age twenty-four and their children equitable opportunities for growth through a collaborative approach of resource partnership and innovative services in partnership with the Greater Albany public school district.</p> <p>The workgroup asked about where the program was housed. Andrea explained that they don't have their own facility and are currently using space at Hub City Church twice a week.</p> <p>The workgroup shared their experience working with Young Roots. It was noted that they offer and foster a safe sense of community for the parents they serve. Young families have felt comforted and grounded by Young Roots.</p> <p>The workgroup expressed appreciation for the work of Young Roots in the community.</p>	

The workgroup discussed pregnancy rates in Linn and Benton counties and the difficulty of getting data on this topic during the pandemic.
