	"Support Connect Oregon statewide."

- 1) What does "supporting" Connect Oregon mean?
- 2) What specific obstacles do we have to supporting Connect Oregon?
- 3) What benefits do we get from supporting Connect Oregon?

Unite Us – Workgroup questions and concerns:

- How to get a license?
- How to use the program?
- Not all organizations have the Internal capacity to use it (Scope, Scale, and Fit).
 Will there be funding for small organizations to increase staff time to use Unite Us? Especially in organizations that run off of volunteers.
- Will the software be helpful for small programs?
- Concerns about big data systems. Investments in training and technical support in the future.
- So many referrals are already through other platforms. Many organizations have built their own referral systems.
- How will Unite Us align with Epic and OCHEN?
 - o They are separate systems that require data entry into both systems. There is no bidirectional use at this time. This is a big frustration.
- It won't work unless everyone is on it. However, there are a lot of barriers and

minimal incentives for its use.

- If the client could create an account and then select the services they're looking for, it would make it less daunting on the services side.
- Nurses and WIC staff do not have direct access to Unite Us. More licenses are needed, so all relevant staff must be able to send referrals.
- Navigating Unite Us is difficult. It is hard to find agencies to refer to. It is not searchable by location or agency name. Categories are not well-defined enough. Some overlap and some are too broad.
- Classes and workshops are not easy to list in Unite Us.
- Could something be "pitched" to the legislature? Businesses have requirements to meet. What if one of those requirements is that certain types of business organizations must be in that system?
- Unite Us does not track Social Determinants of Health

Unite Us Provides:

- Closed loop referrals
- Connection to Health Care

The 1115 waiver is the official agreement approved by the federal government that allows the state of Oregon to set its own Medicaid rules. https://www.oregon.gov/oha/HSD/Medicaid-Policy/Pages/OHP-Waiver.aspx

The waiver requires a social needs questionnaire. There are still questions about who this waiver applies to and which agency is most appropriate to help a family complete it.

IHN is trying to get the waiver system built into Unite Us. That is in the process but not yet available.
